- increasing the level of individualization and differentiation of students' activities;
- the ability to choose the speed and volume of educational material, the level of its complexity, the implementation of feedback control and diagnostics, increasing the level of its objectivity [3].

Internet resources not only provide a number of additional means of implementing interpersonal and international relations, but also create new opportunities in the field of education [5].
